Students in Dr. Leah Misemer's English 1102 "Comics and Civic Engagement" class will host an opening for an exhibition featuring their original research-based comics about urban development issues in Atlanta. Topics discussed include gentrification around the Beltline, problems senior citizens face during relocation, poverty in suburban areas, and the role sustainability plays in community development. In order to highlight the problem-solving aspects of creativity students have explored during the course, the exhibit will also feature entries from multimodal journals, sketchnotes, and visual annotations.
