Her work has been recognized by the Southeast Emmys, Georgia Association of Broadcasters, Public Radio News Directors Inc, Associated Press and Society of Professional Journalists, as well as by the Georgia Historical Society. As GPB's News Director of TV, Radio & Digital, Bevington led the news team to win two regional Emmys and GPB's first national Edward R. Murrow Award. In the spring she traveled throughout Europe studying public policy issues impacting the U.S. and the European Union as a recipient of the prestigious Marshall Memorial Fellowship by the German Marshall Fund of the United States.
