
The finished mural. There are five recycling alcoves in the Klaus building. Now they have all been decorated.

## **Electronics Recycling**

In 2012, Georgia Tech recycled 154,600 pounds of electronic waste (E-waste). This includes state-owned property, such as retired equipment from the computer labs on campus, as well as personal E-waste that students, faculty, and staff have brought from home.

You can recycle your <u>personal</u> E-waste during Georgia Tech's annual Earth Day Celebration on **April 19!** (No Georgia Tech/state property.)

The 2013 Earth Day Celebration is on Friday, April 19, from 10 am to 3 pm. If you have any obsolete electronics collecting dust at home, bring them with you and they will be recycled by Atlanta Recycling Solutions. There will be a drop-off table located on Tech Walk, for those on foot who are dropping off small items. If you have items in your vehicle, the Zone 9 visitor parking lot will be used as an E-waste drop off area during the Earth Day Celebration. There is a \$10 suggested donation for televisions, to cover the cost of recycling them, but all other accepted items can be dropped off free of charge.
