

2010 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

GEORGIA INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY

• Secure \$7 million in bonds to fund the furnishing and equipping of the Clough Undergraduate Learning Commons.

The General Assembly approved final construction funding in FY10 for this multi-purpose academic support facility. This funding will outfit the building for use by students on completion.

Secure \$139.8 million in new Formula Funds among all USG institutions to adjust for enrollment growth.

With the largest student population ever, an increase to these day-to-day operating funds is critical to Tech's maintaining educational quality.

Secure \$75 million in Major Repair and Rehabilitation Funds among all USG institutions to repair aging facilities.

In a period of slow economic growth and construction, funding contributed toward maintaining facilities will allow the Institute to be a good steward of existing public investments.

- ▶ **Secure \$4.5 million** to construct the Eco-Commons water relocation project. *The Eco-Commons will help Tech manage its*
 - The Eco-Commons will help Tech manage its storm water while providing new green space.
- Secure renewal of the provision allowing carry-forward of certain USG funds.

Under this provision, Tech can carry certain funds from one fiscal year to the next, allowing for better planning and allocation of resources.
