**Interdisciplinary Teaching***Within my coursework:*

My seminar course, Arch 6120/4803/CoA 6120, "Retrofitting Suburbia" focuses on urban design and attracts students from four degree programs: BS.Arch, M.Arch, MS-UD, and MCRP. Discussions engage students in learning from each other and incorporating lessons from real estate economics, sociology, landscape architecture, urban ecology, new urbanism, public policy, public health, and design. 2010

My lecture course, Arch 6132 "Architectural Theory and Criticism II" reflected the interdisciplinary nature of contemporary architectural theory. Lectures on structuralism and post-structuralism engage ideas from structural linguistics, structural anthropology, literary criticism, and critical theory. Lectures on late capitalism, globalization and post-industrialism introduce neo-marxist and New Economy concepts into studies of development patterns. A lecture on agendas of race and gender in architecture similarly engages contemporary thought in sociology, women's studies, African-American studies, and post-colonialism. A lecture on sustainability and new environmental agendas incorporates discussion of energy-efficiency, green building techniques and land-use impacts. 2001-2009

*Massachusetts Institute of Technology:*

Only member of the Architecture Department to be based in one area, "Architectural Design," and simultaneously teach in and attend faculty meetings in other areas ("History, Theory, Criticism" and "City Design and Development.") Gave several guest lectures in all three areas.

*University of Virginia:*

Founding member of the committee that both developed the curriculum for and taught "Environmental Choices for Responsible Professionals", a course with 18 faculty from 14 different academic units on the campus. The course won an AIA Education Honor Award for innovative and transferable teaching in 1992.

Chaired interdepartmental School of Architecture Curriculum Committee responsible for finding and promoting interdisciplinary opportunities and efficiencies in the architecture, landscape architecture, city planning, and architectural history curricula. Gave several guest lectures in the different departments of the School of Architecture, as well as in the English Department.

**Authorship of Instructional Materials**

I have co-taught Arch 6132, Architectural Theory and Criticism II with June Williamson in 2001 and Sonit Bafna 2002-2009 and Frances Hsu 2007-2009. In all cases, the syllabus has been based on the very similar courses I taught at MIT and UVA in contemporary theory. I have been teaching contemporary theory as the field has been developing and my syllabi in this area have been recognized as significant and published in two volumes of *Architecture Reading Lists and Course Outlines* (Durham NC: Eno River Press, 1991 and volume 4 in 1998)

There are many service activities that I took on as Director. These include:

NAAB accreditation (twice!), Institute Assessment, Strategic Planning, collaboration with other units and institutions, budgeting, curricula, faculty hires, teaching assignments, mentoring, RP&T letters, evaluations, student affairs, recruitment, admissions, scholarships, GTAships, working with student groups: AIAS, NOMAS, and SAC, lectures & exhibitions, website and other means of program promotion, donor stewardship, meetings with alumni and the Professional Advisory Board, arranging of special events and reporting to the Dean.

Some of the most significant accomplishments of my tenure as Director include:

Successful advancement of the Program's two focal directions during my first term as Director:

1. Bridging between the physical and the digital: through the introduction of lasercutters, courses at the Advanced Wood Products Lab, new focus on digital design in 2<sup>nd</sup> semester grad and undergrad studios and the activities of the three Ventulett Chairholders
2. Improving the Everyday Landscape: through collaboration with the Center for Quality Growth and

Regional Development, development of the MS in urban design, first joint hire between Architecture and City Planning, several joint electives with Building Construction, expansion of offerings related to sustainability, and the commitment to having the spring juniors studio operate in a suburban context.

Two full term 6-year NAAB accreditations

Ten tenure-track hires – 60% of whom helped to diversify the faculty, (although many have since been recruited away)

Arrangements for the Program’s first chaired professor and related activities – including searches, assistants, installations, symposia, etc.

Arrangements and hires for new Visiting Critic and Visiting Scholar positions

Measurable increases in faculty productivity through modified teaching loads

Expansion and diversification of the MS areas of concentration, especially in Urban Design, Building Ecologies and Environmental Technologies, and in Classical Design

Graduate student access to the Paris Program for 1 semester

Among the highest levels of participation in Georgia Tech’s International Plan

Growth of the NOMAS chapter (National Organization of Minority Architecture Students) from dormant status to National Chapter of the Year

Expansion of outreach and engagement with city leaders and professionals

Numerous special events including the centennial celebrations, symposia, exhibitions, and collaborations with the High Museum, Museum of Design Atlanta, the Whitney Museum of American Art, Southface Energy Institute, and Landmark Cinema.

Low part-time faculty salaries remained a serious disappointment.

**Outreach Activity Including Public Service**

The Architecture Program at Georgia Tech regularly conducts studios that assist communities and non-profits think through the architectural and urban design options facing them. Often, I was directly involved in vetting and then matching requests with a particular faculty member’s studio. Other times, the faculty member led and I simply supported. I’m proud of the contributions these studios have made both to the communities and to the students’ understanding of architecture as a service. Examples of both include:

West End TOD; lidding the downtown connector; Crabapple; KidsGym; downtown Multimodal Station; Covington infill; infill in historic minority neighborhood in Newnan; community centers in Mechanicsville and Reynoldstown; cultural arts center in Sweet Auburn; elderly housing in Lincoln, AB; Atlanta Gas & Light site; GA State dorms; Barrington Hall; dead mall in Rockdale County; Midtown Arts district; 25-year development strategy for Samborondon, Ecuador; Chattahoochee Hill Country hamlet building and new town plan for Fulton County; Imagine Downtown studio; Buford Highway redevelopment; Oglethorpe mixed-use masterplan; Marion Square in Charleston; HABS drawings of the downtown flatiron building; various Beltline studios; Northside Corridor studio; electrical substation enclosure workshop, Hedgewood Properties modern housing, Community Center for Serenbe, Green Habitats studio, Georgia Peanut Commission Headquarters, Hazlehurst Theater, City of Refuge Clinic, Green teaching hospital for Health in Harmony in Borneo.
