About the Homecoming Steering Committee

Earlier this year, the outgoing Greek Life's Homecoming Executive Board felt the need for several changes in the administration structure and general event rules in response to the past inefficiencies in running Homecoming. Therefore, Greek Life's Homecoming Executive Board and the Student Center Programs Council Homecoming Committee proposed combining efforts in order to host a more successful Homecoming.

In order to facilitate dialogue between the two groups, governing councils within Greek Life encouraged members to apply to be part of the SCPC Homecoming Committee, as well as have Homecoming representatives that would be responsible for reporting back information to the councils. From this arrangement, the Greek Executives chose to continue their responsibilities in hosting Mock Rock and Banner & Pomp Display, but transferred the duties for certain field events to the SCPC Homecoming Committee.

In addition to the collaboration between Greek Life and SCPC, it was determined that a larger group would be established to support other various groups that hosted Homecoming events. Thus the Homecoming Steering Committee included representation from SCPC, Greek Life, Ramblin' Reck Club, Alumni Association, Student Alumni Association, Alpha Phi Omega, TEAM Buzz and any other organization that hosted a Homecoming event.

The Homecoming Steering Committee will provide an effective means for communication and collaboration amongst organizations that host Homecoming events and to address big picture Homecoming concerns, while serving to inform all stakeholders about the status of events and programs. But above all, the Homecoming Steering Committee's main purpose is to provide a cohesive, campus-wide Homecoming celebration, in which all of the Georgia Tech community can participate in.

Team Category Definitions

The various organizations that contribute to Georgia Tech's Homecoming have come together and decided to incorporate more of the student population in the Homecoming events.

This year, there will be four categories for the different types of teams participating. Below are their definitions.

- Sorority Teams: Sororities that are members of the Collegiate
 Panhellenic Council (CPC), Multicultural Greek Council (MGC), or
 National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) will be able to participate under
 this category.
- Fraternity Teams: Fraternities that are members of the Interfraternity Council (IFC), Multicultural Greek Council (MGC), or National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) will be able to participate under this category.
- Housing Teams: Groups consisting of students who live in the same building or on the same floor of an on-campus Residence Hall can join this group.
- Independent Teams: Any group of students can come together and participate under this category. They may be members of a registered student organization or just a group of friends. Any group of friends will need to have a group name when turning in applications for event participation.

Eligibility Requirements

 Candidates must be full-time, registered undergraduate or graduate students of the Georgia Institute of Technology during the Fall 2011 semester. Co-op and Intern students recognized by the Division of Provisional Practice are also eligible. Graduate students are eligible, but may only use activities, GPA and relevant information that have been accrued since beginning Graduate school. Graduate students who completed their undergraduate studies at Georgia Tech may use undergraduate activities and accomplishments. Graduate students in their first semester of graduate school, without an established graduate GPA, may use their undergraduate GPA. Past Mr. Georgia Tech and Ms. Georgia Tech recipients are ineligible.

- 2) Candidates must have 90 credit hours and a senior class standing. This must be their last fall semester.
- 3) Candidates must have a minimum GPA of 3.15 and have started Georgia Tech during the fall semester of 2009 or before.
- 4) Candidates must be nominated in one of the following ways.
 - a) Candidates may be nominated by a group of 50, or more, people, who must individually sign the attached endorsement sheet.
 - b) Candidates may be nominated by an officially recognized student organization. Officers of the nominating student organization must sign the attached endorsement sheet.
- 5) Each organization may only sponsor one candidate for Mr. Georgia Tech and one candidate for Ms. Georgia Tech.

RULES AND SELECTION PROCESS:

- 1) Candidates must personally fill out all sections of the application, and return the application packet to Room 343 of the Student Center, located on the third floor of the Student Center, by 4:30 PM, on Friday, October 7, 2011. A representative of the candidate/sponsoring organization is allowed to turn in the application of behalf of the candidate. When turning in your application, please also sign up for an interview appointment. The entry fee must also be submitted at this time.
- 2) A panel will review the attached essays and give them a score of '1,' '3,' or '5.' This score will count for the respective percent of your final score as a Mr. Georgia Tech or Ms. Georgia Tech candidate. (If your

- essay receives a score of '3' you will have a 3% out of 5% for the application portion of the final score, etc.)
- 3) A panel of judges will interview all contestants on Sunday, October 9, 2011, on the third floor of the Student Center, for the selection of 10 semifinalists for each category. Semifinalists will be interviewed again on Friday, October 14, 2011.
 - a. Judging will be based on the following criteria:
 - i. Communication skills
 - ii. Self Assurance
 - iii. Activities/Honors
 - iv. Enthusiasm and School Spirit
 - v. Campus and Community Involvement
 - vi. Leadership Ability
- 4) During the interviews, the judges will have questions that will be used uniformly for all candidates.
- 5) Based on the scores of the primary interviews, the candidates will be narrowed to a field of 20 individuals (10 Mr. Georgia Tech candidates and 10 Ms. Georgia Tech candidates). These candidates will then participate in a second round of interviews, as well as be voted on by the student body. These students will be notified the day following the primary interviews.
- 6) During the second round of interviews semifinalists will be expected to give a 5 minute presentation, on a specific topic, which will be followed by up to 10 minutes of questions. The presentation should include a platform for an event that the candidate would host in Spring 2012 if chosen as Mr. Georgia Tech or Ms. Georgia Tech. More details will be given to semifinalists after the first round of interviews.
- 7) All semifinalist candidates will attend a mandatory photo session at the time of their first interview on Sunday, October 9th, 2011. These pictures, along with biographical information will be used by the Homecoming Committee for the online voting website, and possibly the Technique. All candidates will have the opportunity to approve the information beforehand.
- 8) The 10 semifinalists for each program will be voted for, on-line from 10:00 AM on Wednesday, October 19, 2011, to 4:00 PM on

- Wednesday, October 26, 2011. The 5 finalists for each program will be determined by the secondary interview score (55%) and voting (40%). Finalists will be notified via email, by 5 pm on Wednesday, October 26, 2011. In the case of a tie between two candidates, the candidate with a higher GPA will be chosen.
- 9) All semifinalists must be present at Talent Show on Tuesday, October 25, 2011. All finalists must be present at Mock Rock on Wednesday, October 26, 2011, and the Alumni Association Tailgate and Homecoming Game, on Saturday, October 29, 2011. The recipient of each program will be announced during half-time ceremonies at the Homecoming Game on Saturday, October 29, 2011.
- 10) All judges will have, and use, copies of the submitted applications during the interview process. Interview judges will not see the endorsement sheets or essays.
- 11) Mr. Georgia Tech and Ms. Georgia Tech may be called upon during their tenure to make appearances at Georgia Tech activities. These may include hosting the Up With the White and Gold awards, participating in Georgia Tech recruitment sessions (with Admissions) such as, Saturday Information Sessions, Preview, Connect With Tech, etc.
- 12) In order to increase voter participation, virtual campaigning will be allowed in the 2011 Mr. Georgia Tech and Ms. Georgia Tech contest. Campaigning cannot begin until 24 hours before online voting begins.
 - a. Allowed Campaigning includes: sending out emails to various list-serves including links with how to vote, creating Facebook groups and events, making YouTube videos or other online promotional materials.
 - b. Prohibited Campaigning includes: ANYTHING tangible (flyers, gifts, buttons, bribes etc.) or audible (announcements in class, sponsoring organizations hosting events in the finalist's name, asking for people to vote for you etc.). Campaigning before 10:00 AM on Tuesday, October 19, 2011 is not allowed. Finalists who engage in prohibited campaigning activities will be immediately disqualified at the discretion of the Student Center Programs Council Homecoming Committee.

Please remember to:

Read all materials carefully. The candidate and their sponsor organization are expected to be familiar with all rules and regulations. Complete all of the necessary information before turning in your application.

Include a check that pays for your entry fee (\$35). Applications will not be accepted unless the fee is paid. This fee must be paid by the sponsoring organization, if an Official Georgia Tech Student Organization sponsors the candidate. For candidates that are endorsed by groups of fifty people or more, personal checks will be accepted. This fee must be paid to cover the cost of the photography and award presentations. One check for \$70 may be used for both female and male participants provided both applications

accompany the check. Checks should be made payable to the **Georgia Tech Student Center** and the name(s) of the participant(s) should be written as the memo.

When completing your application, please type your answers in Times New Roman, size 12 font. Do not modify this application in any way. All candidates must use the application provided. Applications (all materials) are due: Friday, October 7, 2011 by 4:30 pm, to Room 343 of the Student Center (located on the third floor of the Student Center, opposite the Ballroom). Please remember to select an Interview Appointment when turning in your application. All candidates will participate in the first round of interviews, on Sunday, October 9, 2011. Semifinalists (10 males and 10 females) will then be chosen based upon application and the first-round interview scores. The second round of interviews will take place on Friday, October 14, 2011, only semifinalists will participate in these interviews. If your organization is sponsoring a booth, please fill out the Carnival Booth application and return it to Room 343 of the Student Center on Friday, October 7_{th} , 2011; starting at 9:00 a.m. \sim 4:30 p.m. Your organization can have whatever idea you wish as your booth, you have the option of choosing from one of the twenty booths we've already listed, or you may choose to create your own. Booth ideas will be on a first come, first serve basis and there will be no duplicates, so please prepare a few different ideas.

DESCRIPTION:

A traditional, New Orleans Carnival at our very own Tech Square! Various campus organizations will be running their very own carnival booths to provide the entertainment. If you're hungry, you can enjoy some of your all-time favorite carnival concessions like cotton candy and popcorn! Tickets to play the carnival games can be purchased at the Carnival. You can get 2 tickets for \$1.00, or 15 tickets for \$5.00. One hundred percent of the proceeds will go to the American Red Cross.

Each organization is responsible for the set-up of their booth. If needed, we can provide you with one 6 foot folding table (\$10 fee), otherwise each organization will also be responsible for the creation of their booth. Booths

can be as simple as setting up a few tables, or you could go all out and make your booth as authentic-looking as you like.

Booths don't always have to be "booths," if you choose to do a dunk tank; your booth would be the dunk tank. Each organization is responsible for setting-up the booth before the carnival, and taking it down after the carnival. Organizations that do not "tear-down" and clean up after their booths will be charged a \$25 fee for the clean-up of their booth and have 20 points deducted from their overall points total.

Participants whose booths will require electricity or water are responsible for notifying the Student Center Programs Council Homecoming Committee about their needs on their application, and will possibly be required to pay whatever fees are incurred by the necessary set-up.

All booth ideas are subject to approval by Risk Management.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

There will be two booth contests that take place during the Carnival: "Best Booth," and "Judges' Choice."

Best Booth: The winning booth will be determined by those booths turning in the most tickets. Each ticket "spent" at the booth MUST have the organization's name written on the back before the ticket is turned in to be counted. ALL tickets must be kept in a decorated box to be turned in immediately after the carnival. (Each box must be provided by each individual organization with the organization's information clearly displayed.)

Judges' Choice: The wining booth will be determined by a panel of judges. These judges will walk around the carnival and observe all booths before making their final decision.

POINTS WILL BE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS:

All Participants receive 10 points for their participation.

20 points will be deducted from each organization for not cleaning up their booth.

Each booth may only charge one ticket per game. Booths charging more than one ticket will be disqualified from the event.





Teams

- 2) Every member of the team must face the camera and have their entire face visible in the team photo. Any team member not present in the team photo will not be permitted to participate in Ghost Buzzters.
- 3) Each person will receive a water gun pack containing: 1 water gun and the ID Card/Validation form.
- 4) The Captain will act as the contact person for each team.

Game play

- 1) Each team's goal is to shoot and "tag" as many players as possible in order to gain the most team points before noon on Friday, October 28, 2011. A "tag" is defined as squirting a person on their main upper torso so that a water stain is visible.
- 2) Game time is open anytime during the week, but the game cannot disrupt classes, meetings, campus/city activities, or take place within a player's room or office.
- 3) All players registered for Ghost Buzzters are targets and can be shot by any player on any team.
- 4) All players must carry their GhostBuzzter ID/Validation pamphlets with them at all times. Once a player is hit, he or she must give their ID code to the shooter and the victim needs to sign the validation form and provide the date to conform the hit. Being unarmed does not exclude you from turning over ID code.
- 5) After receiving another player's ID code, the shooter needs to go online to fill out the hit submission form.
- 6) When a player is shot and does not have the ID card/Validation pamphlet, the tagged player must provide a sheet of paper with the following information: Name of tagged player, Organization, Name of Shooter, Date, Signature of both parties. Any of these papers collected must also be turned into the Student Center Programs Area.
- 7) Any sheet not including ALL of this information will not be considered in the points calculations.
- 8) Each player may strike a target at most once a day. A day is defined as starting/ending at 12:00 AM. While that player cannot hit that target again, any other member of that team may hit that target in that same day.
- 9) All players must use the water guns provided in the water gun pack **NO OTHER WATER GUNS/WEAPONS ARE ALLOWED**. Lost

guns can be replaced at the Student Center Programs Area for a \$1 fee. Broken guns can be exchanged at no cost.

Scoring

- 1) Each regular "tag" is worth 1 point. Each Captain "tag" is worth 3 points. Each celebrity "tag" is worth 5 points.
- 2) 20 extra points will be awarded to a team for hitting every member of another Ghost Buzzters team within the gaming period. This includes teams of all sizes.
- 3) IMPORTANT: The hit codes must be submitted online the day the codes were received otherwise the hit does not count.
- 4) Teams caught trading ID codes will be disqualified.
- 5) After each day, hits will be displayed on the Homecoming website for teams to review and "confirm" their hits.
- 6) If there are any discrepancies after reviewing the daily hits, we will request the "team-in-question" to produce their Ghost Buzzters ID/Validation pamphlets. If the "team-in-question" cannot produce documentation of the "hit-in-question" then the point will not be counted, and said "team-in-question" will be put on probationary status.
- 7) If a team is put under probationary status, they have the risk of being disqualified after further infractions and a review by the Homecoming committee.
- 8) Scores will be tabulated and e-mailed to Captains.
- 9) Top scoring teams and winners will be announced Friday, October 28, by 9:00pm on the Homecoming website.

Celebrities

- 1) Celebrities may participate in the game, and can use any water gun. A celebrity may choose to have the Homecoming Committee provide a water gun if they do not wish to provide their own.
- 2) The celebrity list will also be posted online along with team pictures at a date and time prior to the start of the event.
- 3) Each celebrity target may be shot no more than once per day by each team.
- 4) Participants shot by a celebrity must surrender their ID code just as they would for any other player. Codes surrendered to a celebrity will be counted against a team's overall score.

- 4) Profanity, nudity, and obscene or offensive gestures will not be allowed. Acts that discriminate in any form may be disqualified at the discretion of the judges.
- 5) No animals or fire will be allowed. Possibility of dangerous acts should be reported prior to Talent Show.
- 6) Groups that do not show up during their scheduled time for preliminaries or finals will be disqualified.

1) The maximum size of the display is limited to 8'x5'x7' tall. A build area will be provided to each team either on Tech Walkway, or another predetermined location depending on the number of entries. Each team will be informed of its location prior to the event.

- 2) Aluminum food cans of all sizes may be used to build the display. Cans must be full, unopened, and with labels intact and legible. Labels may not be covered or altered in any way.
- 3) Each structure must be built with a minimum of 125 cans. Any display with less than 125 cans will be disqualified.
- 4) Minimal accessory props are allowed, including boxed foods. Props and boxes should not be a dominating feature of the entry.
- 5) No glass containers, pet food, *alcoholic beverages*, or open or exposed food are allowed. No ramen noodles are allowed.
- 6) The entry must be structurally self-supporting.
- 7) Velcro and clear or double-faced tape may be used as adhesives. High-tension rubber bands, nylon string, and wire are also permissible. No permanent adhesives, such as glues, may be used.
- 8) Foam core, cardboard, plexiglass, and other leveling (but not supporting) materials are permitted.
- 9) Teams may consist of a maximum of 5 students, including a designated team captain. Additional team members are allowed, but no more than 5 people may work on the display at any given time. Teams can and should work in shifts to accommodate additional team members.
- 10) Participants are responsible for obtaining their own supply of canned goods. Donations of canned goods may be solicited from manufacturers, corporations, local stores, Georgia Tech students and faculty, or any other reasonable source.
- 11) All applicants should submit a title and description of the display with the completed application. Descriptions should be no longer than one paragraph. They should include details such as the nature and significance of the display, the choices you made in cans and labels to articulate your theme, your use of double entendres with label names, plays on words, etc. A preliminary sketch or rendering of the proposed design should also be included. These materials will be provided to the judges during judging.
- 12) Each entry must also supply the approximate number of food items used. A preliminary estimate of cans must be indicated on the application, while the exact number should be stated during judging.

- 13) Each team must have two representatives of their organization help break down the cans and dismantle their structure beginning at 2 PM, or the team will be disqualified. All structures must be dismantled by 3 PM on Wednesday, October 26, 2011.
- 14) The displays will be judged based on the following 5 criteria:
 - a. Originality/Creativity 20%
 - b. Amount of Cans Collected 30%
 - c. Theme Relevance 20%
 - d. Neatness/Attractiveness 20%
 - e. Ingenuity of Structure/Structural Difficulty 10%

CONSTRUCTION DETAILS:

- 1) Check-in starts at 8:30 AM on Wednesday, October 26, 2011 on the Tech Walkway.
- 2) Once checked in, teams may begin moving materials to the build site. Each team is responsible for moving its own food to the build site.
- 3) Building begins at 9:00 AM. Any team not checked in by 9:00 AM will be disqualified.
- 4) Spaces will be marked with team name and e-mailed to Team Captain before the day of the build.
- 5) Teams may build at any time between 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM. It is recommended that at least one team member remain at the build site at all times, but participants may come and go as they please. There will be Homecoming committee representatives at each build to ensure that no changes are made after 11:00 AM.
- 6) It is recommended that teams save all boxes. A storage space for packing boxes will be available at the build site. Boxes will be used to repack cans during dismantling and shipment to the local food bank.
- 7) All non-perishable goods will be taken to a local food bank. If any team wishes to redeem portions of the display, they must do so *right after* all structures have been judged or else items will be given away or donated.

All materials must be turned in on Friday, October 7, starting at 9:00am until 4:30pm to Room 343 in the Student Center, along with all of the other Homecoming turn-in materials, or they will <u>NOT</u> be accepted.

- This application includes music selections, stage set-up, participant information, and preliminary sign-ups.
- Entry Fee—\$50 per group. Make checks payable to **Georgia Tech Interfraternity Council Homecoming**.
- Waivers—Each group must have ALL of the waivers (signed and completed by <u>every</u> performing member and <u>every</u> stagehand); therefore, in order to be considered to participate in finals, each group must turn in the waivers of the ALL members/stagehands participating in the event.

DESCRIPTION:

Participating organizations will perform an original act related to the GT Homecoming Theme. All acts must comply with the following rules.

RULES:

1) All performers and stagehands must be official (active) members of the organization with which they are performing and must be

- enrolled Georgia Tech students (interns and co-ops included) with a current GT student ID number (i.e. 90XXXXXXX).
- 2) A maximum of **NINE** performers and **ONE** stagehand per group is permitted. The stagehand must be provided by the organization.
- 3) The final list of performers and stagehands, with their respective GT ID numbers, is due with their application. (If a problem occurs in which a participant needs to be replaced, please email the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee members.)
- 4) All anticipated performers and stagehands must sign the waivers, turned in with the application. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
- 5) Members of the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee, Homecoming Committees, and Greek Governing Boards are not eligible to participate in Mock Rock.
- 6) Performance time—for both preliminaries and finals—is limited to **five minutes** per group, plus an additional minute for set-up and another for takedown (totaling seven minutes). During finals, any group performing outside of its allotted five-minute period will lose its right to place, but will retain its participation points. Official timekeepers, members of the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee, will be present at both events (preliminaries and finals).
- 7) If your group is chosen to participate in finals, the act that is performed for your group's preliminary audition **MUST** be the same act performed for finals. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification. Results of finalists will be notified via email by **Friday, October 14th**.
- 8) A <u>mandatory</u> meeting for all finalists will be held on **Sunday**, **October 23** at 7pm. Attendance at this meeting is mandatory for all organizations that are going to participate in the actual event. All rules will be discussed, performance order will be decided, and all questions will be answered during this meeting
- 9) Each group must have a <u>minimum</u> of **three** song choices and a <u>maximum</u> of **five** in their performance. In the event of content conflict, priority will be determined by the order in which groups turned in their application. Any subsequent groups with a song conflict will be notified by their preliminary performance, and the said group will need to change the song in conflict by **Friday**, **October 14**. If a backup song is in conflict, the organization will be notified and dealt with individually.
- 10) Instruments are **NOT** allowed to make sounds.

- 11) Rented costumes and/or masks will **NOT** be allowed.
- 12) No animals will be allowed. This includes the Georgia Tech mascot, Buzz.
- 13) Remember this is Mock Rock: you are imitating the performer(s) of your choice and lip-syncing. Live vocal talent (i.e. singing, chanting, rapping, etc.) is not allowed.
- 14) No explosives, fire, or any other devices that may be damaging will be allowed on stage, backstage, or anywhere else in the preliminary and final facilities.
- 15) No interaction with the Judges or audience by participants during the performance is allowed. The participants may not enter or leave the front of the stage during their performance.
- 16) No objects may be thrown off the stage during the performance and all extraneous materials must be cleaned off the stage during the time requirement or a penalty of 10 points will result.
- 17) Any damage done to the preliminary or final facility is the financial responsibility of the organization performing. Every participating group must abide by all rules and regulations of the Robert Ferst Center for the Arts.
- 18) Be advised, the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee must deem all acts in good taste. Obscenities and discriminatory behavior will not be permitted. This includes music, language, behavior, gestures, and partial/total nudity. Acts should not offensively reflect characteristics of any group or organization. Any such acts will result in disqualification. These actions are left to the discretion of the aforementioned groups.
- 19) If an act does not include anything about Georgia Tech or the official Homecoming theme—"Buzzing thru the French Quarter: Unmasking the Spirits of New Orleans"—the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee reserves the right to disqualify it.
- 20) All Mock Rock participants are expected to comply with the instructions of any IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee member and/or the venue's employees. Failure to do so will result in disqualification of the responsible organization.
- 21) All Judges' scores and decisions are final and not subject to protest, and individual judges' rankings will remain confidential. This includes preliminaries and finals.
- 22) Homecoming IFC/CPC points as well as non-Greek contestant points will be awarded.

- 23) The IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee and Office of Greek Affairs will have the final say concerning disqualification and participation point distribution.
- 24) In the event of disqualification, the group will lose both participation and placement points in the event.
- 25) Alcohol will not be tolerated. If any member (new member, current, or alumni) of an organization is found in possession of alcohol or visibly under the influence at the event, he/she will be asked to leave the event and their organization will be disqualified—that organization will lose ALL points related to Mock Rock.

Application Process:

- 1) Mock Rock Applications must be submitted by Friday, October 7 by 4:30 pm to Room 343 in the Student Center. It is the applicant's responsibility to make sure the application is complete when submitted. Priority for music selection will be determined by correct application submission.
 - a) Incomplete applications include: missing song titles, artists, GT ID numbers, performers' names, stagehands' names, etc.
- 2) The entry fee (check) and waivers are due with your application. Please put these documents in an envelope to distinguish your submissions from other organizations'.
- 3) Only one entry form will be accepted per organization.
- 4) The process for solving the overlap of song selections will be based on a first-come, first-serve basis upon receipt of the application. No organization will be allowed to use the same song. The organization that turns in their application first has priority, marked with a time stamp at time of submission. The conflicting act will not be able to use that song and will be notified by Friday, October 14. They will be allowed to change their song preference only for the conflicting song and must do so by Thursday, October 20. If a backup song is in conflict, the organization will be notified and dealt with individually. (Also stated in Rule #9 under "General Rules")

Preliminaries:

1) You must bring a copy of your CD to preliminaries. This CD will be used in the final round if you are selected, so please be prepared to leave this copy with us with a protective case/sleeve. That CD will be tested at the Ferst Center prior to finals. Please clearly label the CD with the following information:

- a. organization's full name,
- b. list of songs and respective artists (in order of use),
- c. contact person for the organization and his/her phone number.
 - i. If a song change does occur, by approval of the Mock Rock Chairs, a new CD needs to be submitted with the changes and correct labeling. The organization will be contacted by the Mock Rock Chairs to determine an appropriate deadline.
- 2) Any "surprises" or "additions" of any sort which were not approved by the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee may result in disqualification. In extreme cases, this will also result in the prohibition of participating in next year's event. If any minor changes need to be made before preliminaries, please inform the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee immediately. No significant changes can be made unless decided by IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee (i.e. music selection conflicts). If changes are made without approval, your organization will not be allowed to participate in finals.
- 3) Mock Rock Preliminaries will be held Sunday and Monday, October 9 and 10 from 12:00pm to 7:00pm, location TBA. Individual times will be assigned at random, based on the preferences stated on the application. Times will be e-mailed out Friday night, October 7 after all applications have been submitted.
- 4) Each act must be present 10 minutes before their respective preliminary stage time to check in. The entire act must be present. Each participant must present his/her Georgia Tech ID (BuzzCard) at this time. During check-in, participants are expected to be respectful and unobtrusive while other acts are in progress. Any performer or stagehand not present at preliminaries will not be allowed to participate in finals. If one of your participants cannot be present, immediately inform both Mock Rock chairs at least one week prior to approve a substitute.
- 5) The IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee members will tape each one of your performances for preliminaries. You will only get to perform your act ONCE—there will be no retakes.
- 6) Each performance recorded cannot exceed 5 minutes in length. For each minute that your group exceeds the time limit, 10 points will be deducted from your preliminary score, which may consequently prevent said organization from reaching the finals.

- 7) During preliminaries, no one is permitted in the room except for members of the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee and the performing group.
- 8) The only thing supplied for the performers during preliminaries is the location and sound system. Anything else performers need to bring is their responsibility.
- 9) Props and costumes used for preliminaries **must be the same** props to be used for the final performance. Deviation from these costumes without received approval from the Mock Rock Chairs will result in point loss and/or disqualification.
- 10) A drawing or sample of all costumes and props must be submitted for approval to Mock Rock Chairs prior to preliminaries.
- 11) A maximum of 10 groups will be allowed to participate in finals; therefore, not every group that participates in preliminaries will move on to participate in finals.
- 12) A list of the final acts will be selected and notified via email by Friday, October 14 to the Homecoming Representatives contact list.
- 13) The final order in which groups will perform for finals will be determined at random by the mandatory meeting by the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee. The final list will be sent out via email by Monday, October 24.

Ticket Distribution:

- 1) Tickets are required by everyone for entry; this includes performers, stagehands, and spectators.
- 2) Ticket Distribution for Mock Rock Finals will be at the mandatory meeting on Sunday, October 23. Each organization participating in Mock Rock will be given tickets based on a percentage of their roster, as well as the additional tickets for participating members (a maximum of nine performers and one stagehand). Only one representative from each organization will pick up all of the tickets.
- 3) Any tickets that are left over will be available for anyone to pick up on Wendesday, October 26 from 2:00pm to 4:00pm. Distribution will be as follows: one ticket per BuzzCard, one BuzzCard per person. Distribution will be first come, first serve.
- 4) Performers and stagehands will receive their tickets from their representative who comes to pick up their organizations' tickets. They will receive backstage passes—that must be worn at all times except when performing—before finals.

Mandatory Mock Rock Finals Meeting:

- 1) The meeting will be held at location TBA on Sunday, October 23.
- 2) A representative from each organization performing in finals must be present at the meeting. Any organization that is <u>not</u> present will **NOT** participate in finals.
- 3) At the meeting, the final rules will be reviewed, as well as the final scoring.
- 4) All organizations must bring any costumes that were not worn/substituted at preliminaries.
- 5) All final props to be used at finals must be approved at this meeting.
- 6) A final list of performers and stage use will be confirmed based on the list provided with the applications.
- 7) This meeting will be the last time to discuss any issues with the Mock Rock Chairs.

Mock Rock Finals:

- 1) Mock Rock Finals are on Wednesday, October 26, 2011 at 7:00pm at the Ferst Center.
- 2) All Mock Rock Finals performers and help are required to be present at 5:45pm for check-in. All participants must have their Georgia Tech ID at this time. Any group not present by 6:15pm will be **disqualified**. Discretion and timing is up to the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee.
- 3) No one is allowed backstage before or during the show unless they have a backstage pass supplied by the IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee.
- 4) A total of seven minutes will be allotted for each performance: one minute set-up, five minute performance, one minute takedown. All props and costumes must be removed from the stage area within this time. Exceeding the time limit during Mock Rock Finals will result in a 10% reduction in the acts total score for each additional minute or any fraction thereof, affecting finals placement.
- 5) All props, costumes, and equipment must be removed from the facility by midnight after the event. Failure to do so will result in a \$500.00 fine.
- 6) Sound will be provided and cued by IFC/CPC Homecoming Committee members using the CDs provided by each group at preliminaries.
- 7) The act performed at Mock Rock Finals must be the same act performed at preliminaries.

- 8) Only those contestants whose names were submitted to the Mock Rock Chairs on the application and participated in preliminaries will be allowed to participate in finals, unless otherwise discussed earlier with the Mock Rock Chairs.
- 9) The order in which groups will perform will be as emailed and determined at the mandatory meeting.
- 10) The first, second, and third place winners (for each participating category—Fraternities, Sororities, Housing/Independent) of Mock Rock will be announced at the end of the show.

Judging/Points:

- 1. Preliminaries and finals will be judged using the same scoring system. Each category is based on a scale of 0-10, but weighted differently (see below), for a total of 50 points.
 - a. Audience appeal—0.5
 - b. Lip-sync abilities—0.5
 - c. Dance difficulty—1
 - d. Appearance (Costumes)—0.5
 - e. Appearance (Set Design)—0.5
 - f. Creativity/Originality-1
 - g. Overall Performance—1
 - Score calculation:
 - (Category 0-10) * (Category Weight) = Category Total Score
 - Sum of all Category Total Scores)7 categories) = Final Performance Score (maximum of 50)
- 2. Preliminary scores will not affect final scores for placement.
- 3. Points will be distributed among each participating category— Fraternities, Sororities, Housing, and Independent. Groups will receive points for participation in preliminaries, participation in finals, and for placement of first, second and third at the end of finals.

Six people will have 60 seconds to set up a vertical pyramid in a three, two, one fashion. After the 60 seconds is up, the thrower will retrieve the eggs **one at a time**, run a distance of 25 yards, and toss an egg to the person on top of the pyramid. The person at the top of the pyramid will crack the egg so that the yolk of the egg lands in the cup, which will be located on the head of the participant lying on the ground directly in front of the pyramid. Then, the runner will run back to the start line, retrieve one egg and run back to the 25-yard line, and so forth. The team with the most yolks in the cup at the end of a 2-minute period wins.

RULES

- 1) Two teams will participate in this event simultaneously. Any interference with the opposing team will result in disqualification and a loss of participation points. Interference includes obstructing the other team or tossing eggs anywhere other than to the team member at the top of your pyramid.
- 2) No kneepads, padding, etc. will be allowed for those in the pyramid,

- as judged by the Events Chairs. Pyramids must be built "on hands and knees" style, lying down formations will not be acceptable. The elbows of participants in the pyramid must be straight at all time with the exception of the participant at the very top of the pyramid.
- 3) If the runner obtains more than one egg at a time, his/her team will be disqualified and will lose participation points.
- 4) If a team's pyramid falls, the team will not be allowed to score any eggs until everyone is back in place. While the team tries to recover, time will continue to expire.
- 5) The participant will lay in front of the pyramid on their back with their head on ground. The participant may wear protective goggles, similar to swimming goggles. (No snorkel masks allowed).
- 6) The person who cracks the egg must make an honest attempt to toss the shell of each egg away from the person lying directly beneath the pyramid.
- 7) In order for an egg to count, the entire yolk must land in the cup. All decisions of the Events Chairs will be final.
- 8) The runner must not cross the 25-yard line when throwing the egg. If he/she does it will result in a disqualification.
- 9) The runner must run back to the 25-yard line before throwing the egg. If the runner throws the egg before he/she reaches this line, it will result in disqualification.
- 10) Any member, whether participant or spectator, seen consuming alcohol or visibly intoxicated will be asked to leave the area of the event. His/her tem will be forfeit the corresponding participation points as well as placement points.

Race Protocol

- 1) Any team representing a co-ed organization will compete in the men's division.
- 2) Each team may consist of four racers and three pit crew members. There may be no more than 7 people in the pit at one time.
- 3) Date, time, and location of tricycle pick up will be announced via email once all registration forms have been received and processed.
- 4) Each team will receive waivers for their riders. The riders must sign the waivers and turn them in at check in.

There may be changes to the Rulesbook until the event starts. Please make sure to check 112 www.homecoming.gatech.edu for the most recent version of the rules book.

- 5) The top ten finishers from last year will be able to choose their seeding and the others will be seeded randomly.
- 6) Check-in on the day of the race will be from 4:30 PM until 4:55 PM. Each team should send ONE representative to the check-in table. The representative should bring waivers signed by each racer.
- 7) Trophies will be awarded for the top three finishers in both the men's and women's division.
- 8) Any organization connected to spectators who are behaving in a disorderly or unsportsman-like manner, or who are causing danger to participants will be disqualified immediately.
- 9) NO ALCOHOL WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE PIT AREA! Any team violating this rule will be immediately disqualified and will receive a one-year suspension from the Mini 500.

Race Specifics

- 10) Teams competing in the men's division must complete 15 laps of the course and women's teams must complete 10 laps.
- 11) Teams will be lined up at the start, 10 in a row, in the following order.
- 12) 1st row: teams 1 though 10
- 13) 2nd row: teams 11 through 20
- 14) 3rd row: teams 21 through 30
- 15) 4th row: teams 31 through 40
- 16) 5th row: teams 41 through 50
- 17) Each team is required to make three pit stops for reversal of the front wheel. The wheel reversals will be recorded by a pit judge appointed by the Ramblin' Reck Club. Only one wheel reversal is allowed per pit stop.
- 18) NO spare tricycle parts will be allowed in the pit area. Teams may not borrow or share parts with other teams, even if one team is no longer participating in the race.
- 19) No welding equipment or power tools are allowed in the pit with the exception of battery-operated screwdrivers.
- 20) Riders are to call out their team number each time they cross the starting line to assist with proper lap counting.
- 21) Lap monitors will be judging to ensure that riders are properly situated with their posteriors on the tricycle at all times. Judges will afford each team three warnings. Upon the fourth warning, the team will be disqualified.
- 22) Any riders caught walking or running will have their team immediately disqualified.

23) Any discrepancies are to be handled by the race judges. ONE team member may approach the judges stand to make a complaint. If multiple organization members approach the judge's stand, the complaint will not be considered. Discrepancies are not to be reported to lap counters as they are busy counting laps.

Tricycle Regulations

- 24) Only tricycles provided by the Ramblin' Reck Club for the 2011 race may be driven in the race. Use of tricycles from previous races or ones not provided by the club will result in disqualification.
- 25) Your tricycle must be painted. **RED TRICYCLES WILL NOT RACE**. An award will be given for the most creative trike.
- 26) Each team is responsible for painting one side of their front wheel white and the other black so that judges can easily check for wheel reversals.
- 27) The front fender of the tricycle may be removed.
- 28) A brace, two feet long or less, may be attached to the tricycle frame under the seat by welding, clamping, or strapping it to only two parts of the tricycle. More than one brace, or a brace attached in more than two places will result in disqualification.
- 29) You may cut off or weld-off your pedals.
- 30) You may weld on the back tires of your tricycle.
- 31) You may weld the seat where it touches the center bar but you cannot raise the seat higher than the tricycle design intended.
- 32) Bolts of any type may be used for the front wheel with the exception of those that can be removed by hand. Examples include wing nuts and cotter pins.
- 33) Wheels may not be filled with fiber glass material
- 34) Modifications to tricycles may only be made during the race under circumstances that require the team to make repairs or continue the race

RULES:

The term 'Reck' below refers to the fixed body or contraption that is being entered into the Ramblin' Reck Parade.

There may be changes to the Rulesbook until the event starts. Please make sure to check 121 www.homecoming.gatech.edu for the most recent version of the rules book.

General

- Absolutely no alcohol will be allowed or tolerated. No obscene, profane, alcohol related or implied effects will be allowed on the Recks.
- 2) Parade Chairmen, Austin Berry's and Daniel Mendel's decisions will be final.
- 3) <u>Absolutely no "burn-outs" will be allowed</u>, and those doing so will be disqualified.
- 4) Sponsors will be allowed in all classes and may be recognized with advertising on the Recks. Sponsors are encouraged in classes where material costs are so high as to be prohibitive.
- 5) Lateness will not be tolerated at any time. Excluding acts of God, the Parade will start on time.
- 6) Applications must be turned in no later than Friday, October 7th, by 4:30 PM. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES. A written description of every entry as per Rule #36 of each applicable category (see below) must be turned in with application or by email to Austin Berry (austin.berry@gatech.edu) and Daniel Mendel (danielmendel@gatech.edu) no later than Friday, October 21st (Please include the phrase '[Reck Parade]' in the subject line). Failure to turn in a complete application packet (application, fees, and written descriptions) will result in loss of points for the category (description only).
- 7) No Reck displaying pomps will be allowed entry into the Parade.
- 8) Recks MUST be removed from Ferst Drive by Sunday, October 30, at 5:00 PM. If an organization's Reck has to be towed from Ferst Drive after this deadline, the group will be responsible for any fees incurred and will be disqualified from competing in Georgia Tech Homecoming 2011 as well as Homecoming 2012.
- 9) All Entries must be removed from the coliseum parking lot immediately after the parade (a valiant effort must be made for those that are not working and if they are left they are subject to the parade chairman's discretion to disallow entry for the following year). If an organization's entry remains in or around the coliseum parking lot, the group will be disqualified from competing in Georgia Tech Homecoming 2011 as well as Homecoming 2012.
- 10) Any organizations that leave their Recks in the streets after the Reck Parade will also incur a \$500.00 fine.

RULES 8, 9, and 10 WILL BE STRONGLY ENFORCED

Safety

- 11) Safety will remain the most prominent consideration for all Recks. No Reck will be allowed into the parade if its operation is unsafe to spectators or its operators. This is at the discretion of the Parade Chairmen.
- 12) All passengers must wear seat belts. Seat belts are defined as anchored straps that buckle across the hips to protect a seated passenger from an abrupt motion. Seat belts must be securely attached to the Reck. In the interest of safety, ropes may not be used as seat belts.
- 13) Brakes are required and must be demonstrated and deemed safe by the parade chairmen before the Parade.
- 14) All entries with combustion engines, electric motors, or other nonhuman propulsion parts must carry a charged, dry multi-purpose chemical fire extinguisher (carbon dioxide). The fire extinguisher will be checked during the Friday inspection.
- 15) Contraptions may not utilize the thrust from direct combustion (i.e. rockets, pulse-jets, etc.) to propel their Recks.
- 16) A maximum speed limit of 10 mph will be enforced on Classic Car entries. A maximum speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced on Fixed Body and Contraption entries. At 5 mph, the distance described in "Point Categories" may be covered in about one minute.
- 17) Recks will be required to keep a minimum safe following distance of five car lengths.
- 18) As dictated by Fire Codes, all Reck constructions must be performed no less than 25 feet from any building. Organizations with limited workspace may build in an area provided and wired by Georgia Tech Facilities. This location may be obtained by filling out a Space Request Form available in the Administration Building, Tech Tower, on the 4th Floor and discussing space availability with Tom Kirby in that same office.
- 19) A Reck may be disqualified at any time at the discretion of the Parade Chairmen on the grounds of safety.

Entry Regulations

20) A first inspection will take place on Wednesday, October 26. This inspection is meant to point out rules violations to the organization. These violations should be fixed by the final inspection, which will be held Friday, October 28. These inspections are not meant to qualify or disqualify a group, although the parade chairmen may disqualify a group at this time. The final Reck will be inspected the morning of the

parade, and if the rules have not been followed it will be disqualified at that time. Alumni will not be required to go through the preliminary inspections, but those Recks will be inspected the morning of the parade. Alumni Recks may be disqualified at this time if ANY rules are not followed (at the discretion of the parade chairmen).

- 21) All Recks must be completely self-propelled (no push power) to receive points for time, and must be so designed to enter the Parade.
- 22) No separate units are allowed unless they are re-attachable parts of the Reck.
- 23) The maximum height for Reck is 13' 0". The maximum length for Reck is 100'0".
- 24) All entries must be equipped with one "Dead Man's" control per motor, which must be at the immediate disposal of the principle operator. This control must be demonstrated on the morning of the parade. A "Dead Man's" control is defined as a switch that removes the power to the Reck. The 'principal operator' is defined as the operator of the vehicle that is directly responsible for starting, stopping, and steering the Reck. If more than one principal operator is needed, there must be one "Dead Man's" control per principal operator per motor.
- 25) All wheels must be street navigable. Only pneumatic (inflatable) tires will be allowed (i.e. no wooden wheels with rubber around the circumference). Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification. Contact with the road by parts of the Reck other than wheels will result in the loss of operational points.
- 26) All Fixed Body and Contraption Class entries must be equipped with two securely mounted hooks (tow hooks) at both the front and back of the Reck.
- 27) A strong material must cover all pulley-type systems, moving chains and gears. Chicken wire will NOT be allowed.
- 28) PARADE SPECIFICS
- 29) If a slow or stalled Reck on the route causes another Reck to exceed the 10 minute time limit, the delayed Reck will not be penalized.
- 30) Recks that break down on the Parade Route will be immediately pulled to the side and allotted five minutes in which to make the necessary repairs to finish the course. For Fixed Bodies and Contraptions, this five-minute period will be counted as part of the overall time allotted for the Reck to complete the route. Only one such grace period will be granted per entry. Failure to make the Reck

- operational will result in disqualification.
- 31) Each entry must have no less than three and no more than ten representatives to follow the Fixed body, and no less than five for the Contraption through the route to assist in the event of mechanical failure. If the Reck requires more than ten people to push, the Parade Chairman must approve the number of people needed in advance.

Alumni

32) Alumni teams will be allowed to enter the Classic Car and Contraption competitions. A trophy will be awarded to the winner of the alumni category. Up to five (5) teams will be allowed to enter a contraption and up to ten (10) teams will be allowed to enter a classic car.

POINTS:

Contraption: Any vehicle with indirect drive train other than that specified under the Fixed Body Category.

- 33) Static: 40 points maximum Mechanical integrity, originality, appearance under static conditions.
- 34) Operational: 40 points maximum How vehicle works, appearance when in motion, ingenuity of motion.
- Contraptions must travel the distance from the middle of 8th Street and 6th Street to 30 yards beyond the Judge's stand (the start and finish will be marked with orange or yellow lines) in 10 minutes. If the Contraption is unable to travel the distance in the prescribed time, it may be pushed to the Judge's stand to be started on time (start up time not to exceed two (2) minutes) and be judged under the "Operational" category listed above. No Reck will be disqualified for not traveling the distance in the prescribed time, but it will not receive points for this category. If it becomes obvious that the Reck will not travel the distance in the prescribed time limit, the Parade Chairman will request that the Contraption be pushed to the Judge's stand.
- 36) Written Presentation: 5 points maximum
 Each entry will submit a written description that includes any special effects, sponsors, history, work completed on the Reck, and anything else of interest. Please write this in paragraph form with a maximum of 150 words and turn it in October 21st via e-mail to Austin Berry (austin.berry@gatech.edu) and Daniel Mendel (danielmendel@gatech.edu). [For further details see Rule #6]

37) Bonus points will be awarded at the discretion of the judges for altered or entirely new entries as compared to the entering organization's previous Homecoming entries. An entry can earn a maximum of 20 bonus points based on drivetrain and frame structure.

Fixed Body: Any vehicle employing a direct drive train (transmission directly propelling drive wheels).

- 38) Static: 40 points maximum See CONTRAPTION rule 32.
- 39) Operational: 45 points maximum See CONTRAPTION rule 33.
- 40) Time: 10 points maximum See CONTRAPTION rule 34.
- 41) Written Presentation: 5 points maximum See CONTRAPTION rule 35.

Classic: Vehicle at least 25 years old.

- 42) Static Presentation: 45 points maximum Overall appearance of operator and passengers, special effects, etc.
- 43) Degree of Restoration: 35 points maximum
- 44) Operational Performance: 15 points maximum
- 45) Written Presentation: 5 points maximum
- 46) Short Summary on the Classic. This must include year, model, make, and owner. History of the car and other facts of interest are strongly encouraged. Please write in paragraph form with a maximum of 150 words and turn it in with the application.

SCORING:

The Winner in each class will be determined in the following manner: Judges will score each Reck based on the point breakdown listed above. The maximum number of points is 100 plus the possible 20 bonus points for Contraption. The points for each Reck will be added, and the Reck with the highest sum of points will be the winner. Second and Third Place Winners will be determined in the same manner.

Sustainable Reck X-Prize (\$3,000.00)

WHAT:

Design, build, and enter in the Ramblin' Reck Parade a Fixed Body or Contraption Reck that is NOT powered directly by petroleum based gasoline or diesel internal combustion engines, and has demonstrably lower impacts on the environment and higher benefits to human well-being.

SUPPORT:

The first five (5) teams to register with the Brook Byers Institute for Sustainable Systems will be eligible for reimbursement of the Ramblin Reck Parade entry fee (\$75 for Fixed Body, or \$100 for Contraption [\$200 for alumni teams]), AND may apply for up to \$500 in additional reimbursed costs. (Teams accepting fee and cost reimbursements are subject to additional requirements described under the RULES and REGISTRATION sections below.)

X-PRIZE:

All teams registered with the Brook Byers Institute for Sustainable Systems and competing in the Ramblin' Reck Parade as per the rules therein, are eligible to compete for the Sustainable Reck X-Prize of \$3000. The X-Prize is offered in addition to any awards or points conferred through the Ramblin Reck Parade or the Georgia Tech Homecoming Competition.

JUDGING:

Points will be awarded as follows:

- 1. As described in the Ramblin' Reck Parade rules under "POINTS" (maximum 120 points total for Contraption and 100 points total for Fixed Body)
- 2. Creativity and innovation in meeting the letter AND spirit of the Sustainable Reck X-Prize competition (maximum 50 pts)
- 3. Environmental and Human Well-being Impact (maximum 50 pts) The winner of the Sustainable Reck X-Prize will be awarded based on the sum of all points. In the event of a tie, the winners will equally share the X-Prize award.

RULES:

- 1. All rules of the Ramblin Reck Parade apply including all GENERAL, SAFETY, ENTRY, and ALUMNI rules.
- 2. All Recks must be built expressly and only for entry into the Rambling Reck Parade. No stock manufactured vehicles (e.g. bicycle, golf cart, electric bike, Toyota Prius, Chevy Volt, Nissan Leaf, etc...) or "competition grade"

vehicles (e.g. GT's EcoCar or GT's Solar Jackets Solar Car, etc...) are eligible.

- 3. Human powered Recks are eligible for the X-Prize, but must be powered mechanically (i.e. pushed or pulled vehicles are not eligible) and the drive mechanism should be significantly different from a traditional bicycle (i.e. stock bicycle drive trains are not eligible). No animal powered vehicles are allowed. Note: while human powered Recks may score higher in the environmental and human well-being points category, the benefit could be offset in the creativity and innovation points category. That is, human powered recks will not have any inherent advantage or disadvantage over motor powered recks.
- 4. The rules do not expressly prohibit the use of petroleum gasoline or diesel engines, however, if they are used, there shall be at least one "energy conversion" between the engine and drive mechanism (e.g. diesel engine _ electricity _ electric motor _ wheels)
- 5. Teams that accept support in the form of entry fee waivers or cost reimbursements must enter a Reck in the Parade and must display the Brook Byers Institute for Sustainable Systems logo and other sponsor logos (TBD) on the Reck at a size that is clearly legible at 20 ft distance from both sides of the vehicle.
- 6. All teams wishing to compete for the X-Prize must submit by Wednesday, October 26 11:59PM via email (chang@gatech.edu) a 1-page description of its Sustainable Reck including the manner in which it addresses the environment and human-well being objectives. These 1-page descriptions will be provided to the judges to aid in evaluation.

REGISTRATION:

All teams must register for the Ramblin Reck Parade and pay the appropriate fee as described in the rules for the parade. To be eligible for the Sustainable Reck X-Prize, teams must also register with the Brook Byers Institute for Sustainable Systems after Monday, October 3 12:00AM and before Friday, October 7 11:59PM by emailing the following information to chang@gatech.edu:

- 1. Name of team
- 2. Contact Person (name, telephone #, email address)
- 3. Preliminary description of Sustainable Reck describing what it is and how it will be powered (approximately 150 words or less)

4. Request for entry fee reimbursement (note: teams should still pay the Ramblin Reck Parade entry fee; entry fees will be reimbursed after the team has made a good faith effort to successfully complete the Parade)
5. Estimated anticipated request for cost reimbursements (up to \$500; teams must show a good faith effort to complete the Parade and provide receipts to receive reimbursements)

The first five (5) entries adhering to the letter and spirit of the Sustainable Reck X-Prize competition that are received after Monday, October 3 12:00AM and requesting entry fee and/or cost reimbursements, will be granted. Time stamp of email receipt will determine order received. Additional teams may be granted reimbursements pending availability of funds. All other entries will remain eligible for the Sustainable Reck X Prize, but will not receive entry fee or cost reimbursements.

Addendum: Flag Football Rules

Flag Football Rules

All rules not mentioned will be governed by the 2007-2008 NIRSA Football Rules Handbook

Game, Field, Players, and Equipment

Each team MUST have matching, numbered jerseys for every player. Legal numbers are expanded to include 0-99. A non-numbered jersey will not be allowed as a "00". Your team captain will specify your team's color at the time of registration. The colors of other teams in your league will also be listed. Your team will forfeit if it fails to have the proper jersey at game time. All numbers must be on the back and at least 6 inches in height. Tape is not permitted!

Shirts must be long enough to tuck in so that they remain tucked in the pants/shorts during the entire down or short enough so there is a minimum 4" from the bottom of the shirt to the player's waistline.

Pants or shorts with BELT LOOPS or POCKETS are prohibited

Towels may not hang form a player's waist or otherwise interfere with the possible removal of a flag. Towels however may be used and kept on the ground in between the pucks before the snap.

All jewelry must be removed including watches, earrings, bracelets, etc. Players may wear soft, pliable basketball or wrestling knee pads on legs, knees and/or ankle.

The game shall be played between two teams of 7 players each on a rectangular field. Each team must have 5 players on the field in order to begin the game.

The field is divided into 4 zones of 20 yards each and 2 end zones of 10 yards each

Each team shall designate a captain to act as team spokesperson and make decisions. Only the captain may talk to officials. Team representatives including players, spectators, team managers, coaches, and group members are subject to the rules.

The use of dangerous equipment is prohibited. Shoes must be worn; cleats are prohibited.

Men will use the regular size, NCAA or NFHS football, while women and co-rec may use either a regular or intermediate-size football. Game balls will not be provided as teams

must use their own footballs. Officials will not handle the football, the offense is responsible for the ball at all times.

The forfeit scores are: Men's 16-0, Women 10-0, and Co-Rec 15-0. If the winning team did not forfeit, the score shall stand as it is at the time of the forfeit.

The winner of the pre-game toss shall have the first choice of options: offense/defense, which goal to defend, or to defer the same choice until the second half.

Playing time and Intermissions

A game shall consist of four quarters with a two-minute intermission. Each quarter shall consist of 5 minutes with the clock stopping once at the two-minute warning of the second and fourth quarter. The clock will run continuously for the first eight minutes, stopping at the two-minute mark and afterwards for the following reasons:

Penalties (may start on referee's ready-to-play whistle)

Scoring plays

Incomplete passes/out of bounds

Injured players

First downs (until the ball is set in play by referee's ready to play whistle)

Official and team time-outs

Change of possession

If a team is ahead by 19 points at the two-minute warning in the second half, the game is over via the mercy rule

Teams will change directions at the end of the first and third quarters.

The ball will be placed on the 14-yard line to begin each half. After every score the ball will be placed on the new offensive team's 14-yard line with a first down, with the zone-line to gain being their own 20-yard line.

Each team is allowed two (2) timeouts per half (one-minute time-outs); time-outs not used in the first half are not carried over into the second half. The clock will stop during time-outs.

Free substitution is allowed after any whistle provided the substitution does not delay the game. However, no offensive substitute may enter unless he joins the huddle and is part of the huddle at the time when it breaks. Penalty: Illegal substitution

The offensive team has 25 seconds to put the ball in play after referee signals "ready for play." Penalty: 5yds, Delay of Game.

A maximum of 20 players are allowed on the roster.

Ties will be broken by the "Texas Tie Breaker" (college overtime rules)

Play will begin on the 10-yard line and teams will have 4 plays each to score

A coin toss will precede "Tie Breaker". The team winning the toss has 3 options: Offense, Defense, or Direction. The opposing team then has the remaining choice.

The object is to score a touchdown and subsequent extra point (1, 2 or 3 points). After team A scores, team B then has 4 plays during which to score. If no team has scored after their respective plays the process is repeated; with each team switching roles.

When a pass is intercepted the defense becomes the offense and begins their series of 4 plays. If the interception is returned for a touchdown, the game is over.

Penalties are assessed similar to the regular game. A team shall be given a new series of 4 plays when an automatic first down penalty is accepted. The zone-line-to-gain will always be the goal line. Dead ball penalties after a touchdown are penalized on the extra point attempt. Live ball penalties committed by either team after team B gains possession during an attempt or an overtime shall be enforced at the succeeding spot. Dead ball penalties (i.e. unsportsmanlike) following a successful attempt will be penalized from the succeeding spot, the team B 10-yard line, if accepted.

Definition of Playing Terms

When the flag belt buckle is clearly "broken" from the ball carrier, the down shall end and the ball is declared dead. A player who removes the flag belt from the ball carrier should immediately hold the flag belt above his head to assist the official in locating the spot where the capture occurred. A player may dive to remove a flag belt as long as no illegal contact is made with the opposing team.

The position of the ball when a player is de-flagged determines the spot of the next line of scrimmage.

A defensive player may not hold, push, or knock down the ball carrier in an attempt to remove the flag, nor shall an offensive player hold, block, hurdle, or run through a defensive player trying to remove the flag belt.

When a runner loses his/her flag belt, either accidentally or inadvertently, play continues. The de-flagging reverts to a one-hand tag of the runner between the knees and shoulders.

The scrimmage line for team A is the yard line and its vertical plane which passes through the point of the ball nearest its own goal line. The scrimmage line for team B is the yard line and its vertical plane, which passes one yard from the point of the ball nearest its own goal line. A colored puck will signify each.

Ball in Play, Dead Ball, Out-Of-Bounds

The ball is declared dead when the ball touches the ground: A) on a fumble B) on a lateral C) on a pass or D) after touching a player on a punt.

The sideline and end lines are considered out of bounds. (Only one foot needs to touch in bounds in order for a pass to be complete).

It is illegal participation if, prior to a change of possession, an offensive player goes out-of-bounds and returns during the down, unless blocked out-of-bounds by an opponent. If a player is blocked out-of-bounds by an opponent and returns during the down, he/she shall return at the first opportunity. During the down, no player shall intentionally go out-of-bounds and return. Penalty: 10 yards.

Series of Downs, Number of Downs

In a series of 4 downs, the ball must be advanced forward past the next zone-line to gain in order for a new series of downs to be awarded. Yardage lines are considered part of the forward zone.

Kicking the Ball

If a punt is to be made, the team punting must announce it before the down starts. After the announcement, the punt must actually be made, and neither team may cross the line of scrimmage until after the ball has been punted.

The kicking team must have 4 players on the line of scrimmage until the punt is made. After receiving the snap, the kicker must punt the ball immediately in a continuous motion. Penalty: 5 yards.

Quick kicks are illegal. Penalty: 10 yards.

The defensive team may not build a pyramid or support each other in any manner in order to block or attempt to block a kick. Penalty: 5 yards from the previous spot.

Snapping, Handling, and Passing the Ball

The ball may be snapped between the legs or to the side of the snapper.

The player who receives the snap must be at least 2 yards behind the offensive scrimmage line. Direct snaps (QB under center) are always illegal.

It is defensive pass interference if an eligible receiver is de-flagged prior to touching the ball on a forward pass attempt.

During the interval between downs, when 2 or more consecutive encroachments are committed by the same team, the penalty will be 10 yards for the second encroachment foul.

The offensive team must have a minimum of four players on the line of scrimmage

All players are eligible for a forward pass. The passer may pass from anywhere behind theline of scrimmage.

The passer shall not intentionally ground the ball in order to avoid a sack. Penalty: 5 yards and loss of down.

Scoring Plays and Touchbacks

A team is given the choice of going for 1, 2 or 3 points after scoring a touchdown. Once the captain makes the choice, it may only be changed if a time out is called. Ways of scoring a successful point-after-attempt: A) By running or passing from 3 yards = 1 point. B) By running or passing from 10 yards = 2 points; By running or passing from 20 yards = 3.

The player scoring the touchdown must raise his/her arms so the nearest official can deflag the player. If the player is not deflagged with one good pull, and the official determines the flag belt has been secured illegally, the touchdown is disallowed. The player is disqualified, and it is a foul. Penalty: 10 yards from the previous spot and a loss of down.

After a safety is scored, the team that is awarded 2 points will automatically gain possession at their own 14-yard line. (No kick will take place)

Players' Conduct

It is illegal to steal or attempt to steal (strip) the ball from a player in possession. The object of the game is to deflag a ball carrier, not to steal the ball. Penalty: 10 yards from the end of the run

Defensive players must make a definite effort to avoid charging into a passer after it is clear that the ball has thrown and may not make contact with the throwing arm. Penalty: 10 yards and automatic first down, added on the end of the play (if positive yards have been gained), if not, 10 yards from the previous spot and automatic first down.

Ball carriers shall not guard their flags by blocking, with arms, hands or ball, the opportunity for an opponent to pull or remove the flag belt. Penalty: 10 yards from the spot of foul.

The defensive player shall not (intentionally or accidentally) hold, grasp, or obstruct forward progress of a ball carrier when in the act of removing the flag belt. Penalty: 10 yards from spot.

Intentionally pulling or removing a flag belt from an offensive player without the ball by a defensive player is illegal. Penalty: 10 yards from spot.

The offensive screen block shall take place without contact. The screen blocker shall have his/her hands and arms at his/her side or behind his/her back. Any use of the arms, elbows, legs, or knees to initiate contact during an offensive player's screen block is illegal. A blocker may use his/her feet in order to gain position before, during and after screen blocking. Penalty: 10 yards

A player who screens shall not:

when he/she is behind a stationary opponent, take a position closer than a normal step from him or her;

when he/she assumes a position at the side or in front of a stationary opponent, make contact with him/her;

take a position so close to a moving opponent that his opponent cannot avoid contact by stopping or changing direction. The speed of the player to be screened will determine where the screener may take his/her stationary position. This position will vary and may be one to two normal steps or strides from the opponent;

after assuming his/her legal screening position, move to maintain it, unless he/she moves in the same direction and path of his/her opponent.

Penalty: 10 yards from spot

Teammates of a runner or passer may interfere for him/her by screen blocking, but shall not use interlocked interference by grasping or encircling one another in any manner.Penalty: 10 yards

Defensive players must go around the offensive player's screen block. The arms and hands may not be used to grab or push the opponent aside (the application of this rule depends entirely on the judgment of the official). A rusher may use his/her arms or hands to break a fall or retain his/her balance. Penalty: 10 yards

There shall be no bumping, checking, or other intentional contact between a defender and an offensive pass receiver. Both offense and defense are limited to screening an opponent. If a player attempting a diving flag-removal trips the ball carrier, there is a penalty of 10 yards from the spot of the foul. The third unsportsmanlike foul by the same team shall result in their forfeiture of the game. There may be changes to the Rulesbook until the event starts.
