If teaching is what you love about your daily duties in academia, then transitioning to private high school education may be an excellent opportunity. Join the Professional Development Committee and four previous Brittain Fellows as they discuss their application process, transition, and current roles in private high school teaching.

Jonathan Kotchian, a former Brittain Fellow (2012-15), teaches English at Horace Mann School in the Bronx, NY. He has also taught at Florida International University and the University of Connecticut.

Lauren Holt teaches English at the Galloway School in Atlanta, Georgia. Her thinking, research, and professional activities focus on the seventeenth- and eighteenth-century lyric, theories and structures of power, and multimodal curriculum development and program design. She teaches year-long senior seminars -- recent titles include *The Bard* (on the power and privilege of writers), *That's So Meta*, and *Politics of Theatre/Theatre of Politics* -- and AP Lit (organized around adaptation and appropriation).

Michael James Griffin II is an Upper School Humanities teacher at Mount Vernon Presbyterian School where he teaches 9-12 courses in English/Language Arts, Humanities, and the Advanced Placement curriculum.

Tom Lolis is an Upper School English teacher at Stratford Academy in Macon, Georgia where he teaches Senior Humanities I and II as well as advises the Gaming Club and the Anime Lunch Club. He recently published "Tante's Demon" in the Pittsburgh-based literary journal *Hot Metal Bridge*.
