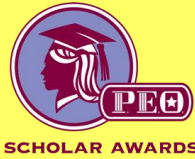


P.E.O. Scholar Awards

Looking for Georgia Tech Applicants
\$25,000 Scholarship Opportunity



The P.E.O. Scholar Awards are one-time, competitive, merit-based awards intended to recognize and encourage academic excellence and achievement by women in doctoral-level programs.

APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS

- Must be a citizen or legal permanent resident of the U.S. or Canada
- Must have a bachelor's degree, at a minimum, and be enrolled at an accredited U.S. or Canadian college or university.
- Graduation date range for completing her doctoral-level degree is April 2028 – August 2029.
- Is expected to be enrolled full time during the year of the award, specifically Fall 2027 and Spring 2028.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

- One-time, competitive, merit-based awards
- Applicants demonstrate leadership positions, ability to significantly contribute to their chosen field of study and community service.
- Exact number and dollar amount of awards are determined each year in accordance with the funds available
- Recipients are notified of their award by May 1

HOW TO APPLY

Chapter B PEO is locally based in Atlanta. We will accept applications, review and interview candidates. Our selected candidate(s) will then submit an on-line application to PEO International. To apply, we need the following information submitted to GACchapterBPEO@gmail.com by **October 5**. Questions can also be directed to Margaret at (205) 516-0075.

1) The student's CV, which must include their **email address, telephone number, address information, and expected date of graduation**.

2) **One** recommendation letter from a professor.

3) A 1-2 page (single-spaced) statement from the student explaining her research written in a way that non-experts can understand. She can also mention papers, presentations given, or other contributions she has made to her field, and she should articulate the impact she hopes her research will have on society. She should state briefly her career goals, her involvement in community work (Tech, Atlanta, or elsewhere), volunteer work, or social and academic organizations. If applicable, the student should note how she has helped further the advancement of women (e.g., mentorships or other education programs).
